Up to \$2000 per semester

Qualifications:

1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
2. Be a U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen
3. Be enrolled at NGU as a major in the Education Department
4. Be enrolled in coursework that is necessary to begin a career in teaching
5. Academic Qualifications:
 - a. Score in the 75th percentile or above on one part of the SAT
- OR**
- b. Score 24 or higher on the ACT composite
- OR**
- c. Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25. Financial Aid will review academic eligibility after each semester.
6. Sign a Teach Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS)

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Step 1: CAUTION!!! You must teach in a high need area **in a school serving low-income students for four out your first eight years of teaching. Look at:**

If you do not meet all of the Teach Grant requirements the grant will be changed to an unsubsidized loan with interest accruing from the date of loan disbursement. Please study these requirements carefully.

Step 2: Go to www.teach-ats.ed.gov and complete an agreement to serve (ATS)

Step 3: North Greenville University will be notified when you have completed your ATS.

Step 4: Call the NGU Financial Aid Office about one week after you have completed your ATS. At that time, we can check your eligibility and discuss the amount.

Step 5: You will be required to come by the Financial Aid Office after registration to receive an entrance interview.
