Federal Teach Grant Information

In 2018-2019, the TEACH Grant Program provides grants up to \$3,724 annually to students who are completing, or plan to complete, course work needed to begin a career in teaching.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Demonstrate *financial need* which is determined by completing the Free Application for Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA).
- Be a U.S. Citizen or *eligible non-citizen*
- Have a valid Social Security Number (with the exception of students from the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, of the Republic of Palau)
- Be registered with Selective Service if you're male (you must register between the ages of 18 and 25)
- Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment as a major in the Education Department at NGU.
- Score in the 75th percentile or above on one part of the ACT or SAT or have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25.
- Be enrolled at least half-time
- Maintain *satisfactory academic progress* as indicated at <http://www.ngu.edu/satisfactory-academic-progress-page.php>

- 2 Go to <https://studentloans.gov/myDirectloan/launchTeach.action> and complete an agreement to serve (ATS).
- 3 Complete Teach Entrance Counseling at <https://studentloans.gov/myDirectloan/launchTeach.action>

IMPORTANT: If you do not complete your service obligation, all TEACH Grant funds you received will be converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan. You must then repay this loan to the U.S. Department of Education, with interest charged from the date the TEACH Grant was disbursed (paid to you or on your behalf).
