

Eligibility for Tuition Remission (EMTD)

Full-time employees, their spouses and dependent children* are eligible for the following tuition remission benefits at North Greenville University.

- Bachelor's: Full-tuition remission is provided to employees, their spouse and dependent children*. Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 and must show satisfactory academic progress. This scholarship will be awarded for eight semesters of full-time enrollment.
- Master's**: Employees and their spouse are eligible for a 30% tuition discount towards their first master's degree. Students must show satisfactory academic progress. *PA medicine program does not qualify for EMTD benefits (no discount available).*
- Doctor's**: Employees only may apply for a Professional Development Grant. If approved, a 30% discount per course will be applied as EMTD and requires continued employment at NGU for 4 years upon completion of the degree or the last course taken. Should the employee leave the university prior to that time, the grant becomes a loan that must be repaid.

*Dependent child as defined by the FAFSA.

**Tuition remission for graduate level work is a taxable benefit.

Tuition remission is effective only if the employee is employed by the university on registration day of each semester as a full-time (Class I or Class III) employee.

Full-time students are required to make timely application for the S.C. Tuition Grant and Pell Grant. To qualify for the S.C. Tuition Grant, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be filed by June 30th.

The amount of the EMTD will be determined by the following formula:

Tuition less S.C. Tuition Grant and Pell Grant equals Tuition Remission. Any private scholarships may be applied to room and board. The total will not exceed the cost of tuition, room and board. Students will be responsible for the cost of books and fees.

Students receiving EMTD are only eligible for other institutional aid that is earned. Earned institutional aid is comprised of aid that the student has to work for; e.g. workstudy, fine arts scholarships, athletic scholarships and academic scholarships. Students receiving EMTD are therefore not eligible for unearned institutional aid, such as: NGU grant, Endowment, Early Action Scholarship, SC Baptist Scholarship, CRV Scholarship and SC Baptist Employee Dependent.

EMTD benefits will only be used one time per academic course and may not be used toward academic courses repeated due to student dropping a course or raising a previously lower grade.

The maximum amount of federal, state, & institutional scholarships & grants for Full-Time Dependent students may not exceed:

\$13,743 per semester for a Resident Student

\$8,797 per semester for a Commuting Student

Students are responsible for fees and books.

Students may use student loans, private scholarships, and workstudy to pay these additional charges.
