

COLLEGE OF BUSINESS AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP COMBINATION DEGREE TRACKS

Spend less time in the classroom and more time in the field with an accelerated master's degree from the College of Business and Entrepreneurship.

NGU's Accelerated Graduate Business Program allows students to take courses that will apply to both their undergraduate and one of three graduate business degrees. Students can apply up to four undergraduate courses (12 credit hours) to their undergraduate degree.

Students must receive approval from both their academic advisor and the appropriate graduate program director before enrolling in a graduate course. The following criteria must be met for approval for a combination degree:

Completion of a minimum of 75 undergraduate credit hours

A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0

A minimum GPA of 3.0 in the major
