



## 2022 VERIFICATION OF NON-FILING LETTER (SPOUSE)

Since you indicated that you (but not your spouse) filed taxes in 2022, the United States Department of Education requires that your spouse provide a signed and dated statement attesting to the fact that s/he did not file.
