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The following items clarify expectations for joining a SLT.

- 21. Some countries require specific vaccinations for entry, and some trips may recommend specific vaccinations or medications based on CDC guidelines. (For instance, vaccinations for measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis are recommended for travel to any country and are usually required for students in public schools and colleges. Specific medications may be recommended for travel to certain countries, such as chloroquine when traveling to areas with high rates of malaria.) Do you have any objections to obtaining required vaccinations or taking required medications? (Please note: If you do not agree to obtain required vaccinations, this will make you ineligible for certain teams; if your refuse vaccinations that are recommended but not required, you agree to assume all legal, financial, and other risks if you do not follow the recommendations.) Please note if you are willing to follow these guidelines or if you will assume all legal, financial, and other liabilities if you choose not to follow these guidelines and suffer consequences as a result. (Risks could include, but are not limited to, physical illness, death, required medical treatment, evacuation, etc.) YES NO
