

## Loft Beds, Micro-Fridges and Microwaves

#### **North Greenville Loft Rentals**

The University provides a bed for each student in housing with an accompanying mattress. All University beds and mattresses must remain in the residence room they are assigned to. Students who bring their own mattress are expected to abide by this policy and can place their personal mattress on top of the school mattress but cannot remove the University issued mattress from their assigned room. Students should not attempt to bunk University-issued ladder beds without first contacting the Office of Residential Services for instructions and required hardware. The University does not recommend the use of lofts in the residence halls; however, if a student chooses to use a loft, the loft must be a manufactured loft and may not be custom-built or wooden. If a loft bed is brought, the student must store the University bed in their room. All lofts must be assembled and used consistently with the manufacturer's instructions.

By assembling a loft in his/her residence room under this policy, a student does so at his/her own risk and assumes responsibility for the safety, routine inspection, maintenance, and proper use of the loft. The student's assembly of the loft under this policy also expressly waives and releases North Greenville University from any and all harm to property and/or person that may arise from the construction and/or use of the loft. North Greenville University does not accept responsibility for the setup, inspection, maintenance, or safety of any loft that students choose to use.

### Laundry

NGU provides free laundry service on campus. All of the machines are energy-efficient front-load machines.

#### **Micro-Fridge and Microwaves**

Students can bring a micro-fridge and/or microwave for their room. NGU does not provide fridges or microwaves. Only one fridge and/or microwave per room is allowed, so please coordinate with your roommates. Micro-fridge must not be larger than 3.3 cubic feet.

### **Consider Carefully**

Insure your belongings.
The University is not responsible for student's personal property. If you bring any item of value, be sure it is insured. You should record all pertinent information concerning your valuables (Model #, Serial #, etc.).

The school recommends insuring your belongings with renter's insurance. One example is NSSI. They provide very good coverage with low deductibles. You may find information at NSSI.com/education.

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### **Please Do Not Bring**

# The following items are NOT allowed by University Policy:

- Electrical appliances with exposed coils including air conditioners, air coolers, space heaters, toaster ovens, slow cookers, grease cookers, electrical skillets, and hot plates.
- Hoverboards—This policy is mandated by our insurance company.
- Pets–Sorry, pets are prohibited with the exception of fish in small tanks.
- Guns, weapons of any kind, fireworks and explosives are strictly prohibited.
- Water beds

  —These are prohibited because of weight and leaks.
- Darts and Dartboards
- Alcohol, drugs, tobacco—North Greenville University is an alcohol/drug/tobacco-free campus.
- Posters that advertise alcohol, drugs, tobacco or lewd or vulgar material, in any manner.
- Nails or screws
- Drop Cords/Extension Cords of any kind—Only multi-plugs with surge protectors are allowed in the resident halls. This policy is mandated by the fire marshal.
- Oil based scented air fresheners –These are not allowed due to maintenance and safety issues.

## Remember the following when decorating your room:

- On cinder block walls, ONLY blue masking tape or 3M command type hangers may be used to hang pictures, posters, etc. Tacts, painters tape, and 3M command type hangers must be carefully removed. *Double-sided tape* may not be used in the residence halls.
- On wood paneled walls or sheet rock walls, ONLY thumbtacks may be used to hang pictures, posters, etc. Nails & screws of any size MAY NOT be used. 3M command type hangers may be used but must be carefully removed.
- The following MAY NOT be used on any surface in a residence hall room: paint, double-sided tape, duct tape, packing tape, contact paper, nails, screws, poster putty or glue.

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
