



### Eligibility Criteria:

1. The student must be admitted to a degree-seeking program of study at North Greenville University.
2. Summer eligibility is primarily based on any unused student loan assistance from the preceding Fall and Spring terms. Federal Pell Grant funds are reviewed and awarded to eligible students automatically.
3. **Undergraduate students must enroll in six or more hours in order to be eligible for Federal Loans. Graduate students must enroll in three or more hours in order to be eligible for Federal Loans.**
4. The student must meet all eligibility criteria of the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy for federal and state financial aid. Students will be reviewed for Satisfactory Academic Progress after **Spring 2026** grades are posted. Failure to comply with this policy will result in the cancellation of any aid that had previously been offered for the summer school sessions. ### Award Notification:

Summer aid awards will be posted on the student's **2025-2026** MyFinaid Award Summary screen via <https://myfinaid.ngu.edu> (if you have a MyFinaid account) and notices are sent via NGU e-mail. To decline or reduce the summer aid awarded, you need to access your Award Summary screen in MyFinaid to submit your decision.

### Application Procedure for Summer Federal Assistance:

1. The **2025-2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** must be received and verification completed (if required) by **May 1, 2026**. **Transfer students must submit all final, official transcripts from all schools attended so that the hours can be articulated BEFORE their aid eligibility can be finalized for summer 2026.** Students must also submit the Summer Aid Application no later than **May 1, 2026** in order to guarantee processing before summer school starts. Students who submit applications after the deadline are responsible for paying all fees due to the University while financial aid is still in review.
2. **Summer aid offers are based on the actual number of hours you enroll and attend through the Drop/Add period and your housing status. You must inform the Financial Aid Office at any time that your enrollment or housing status changes. This updated information may affect your aid eligibility.**  
**NOTE: Any change in enrollment could result in a change to your financial aid eligibility. Decreases in enrolled credit hours, non-attendance in a class, or a total or unofficial withdrawal from summer classes may result in a loss of eligibility for Federal aid. You may lose eligibility for aid you've already received, including returning funds already received.**
3. Students who are first time Federal Direct Loan borrowers and wish to apply for a Federal Direct Loan for the summer should complete the Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Entrance Counseling on-line at: <https://studentaid.gov> .
4. Graduate students who wish to apply for a Federal Direct Federal Direct GradPLUS Loan for summer should complete the **PLUS Loan Application** on-line at: <https://studentaid.gov> .
5. Students who wish to apply for a Federal Direct Federal Direct Parent PLUS Loan (DLPLUS) for summer should have their parent borrower complete the **Parent PLUS Loan Application** on-line at: <https://studentaid.gov> .

### Disbursement of Aid:

Any loans for which you are eligible will be credited to your student account after the Drop/Add period ends. **Federal Pell Grant, Federal SEOG and other resources will be credited to the student's account based on enrolled hours. Failure to attend in the proper number of hours may result in the student having to immediately repay the over-paid federal funds. Financial aid funds cannot be disbursed until students have accepted their financial aid.** <https://myfinaid.ngu.edu/>.

Once NGU posts a loan disbursement to a student's account, the student borrower will receive an e-mail on their NGU e-mail account within 24-48 hours.
